GULLAH MUSEUM

123 King Street, Unit 6

Stop by the Gullah Museum of Georgetown to learn about the rich history and culture of the Gullah Geechee people and how they shaped America from the Colonial period to today. The museum will offer free activities for children, such as Gullah doll-making, a scavenger hunt, coloring sheets, and games. Admission is \$10; kids under age 16 are free.



GEORGETOWN COUNTY MUSEUM

120 Broad Street

Explore the rich history of Georgetown County from its origins to the present. Children will have the opportunity to make and take a toy as a hands-on activity to learn about the toys children may have played with during the Colonial period.



HOPSEWEE PLANTATION

494 Hopsewee Rd.

Hopsewee will be open with tours of the Hopsewee House on the hour from 10:00 to 3:00. Museum open throughout the day and serving in the tearoom from 11:00 to 2:30. THE RICE MUSEUM

633 Front Street

Located in the Old Market Building behind the iconic Clock and in the adjacent Kaminski Hardware Building, the Rice Museum exhibits a permanent collection of dioramas, maps, paintings, artifacts, and other displays that tell the history of rice cultivation in Georgetown County. The Rice Museum will be open from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm.



KAMINSKI HOUSE MUSEUM

1003 Front Street

The house will be open from 10am - 4pm with stationed docents to share intriguing tales of South Carolinians who shaped our past. The Kaminski House will be offering a discounted flat admission rate of \$8 for all visitors.



MARITIME MUSEUM

729 Front Street

Located in the historic heart of Georgetown, the South Carolina Maritime Museum is dedicated to preserving and promoting our state's unique maritime history and heritage. Visit us and learn about the transatlantic slave trade to South Carolina during the colonial period. Admission is free.



HOBCAW BARONY

22 Hobcaw Road

The Discovery Center will be open regular hours, 9 am-5 pm, with exhibits and docents available to assist attendees. The Discovery tour will be offered at 10 am and again at 11 am. This 2-hour tour of the property is done via a 12-person van. Cost is \$30.00. Hobcaw will also be offering a 3-hour "Revolutionary" Explore Tour for \$40.00 beginning at 1:30 pm-4:30 pm.



TOM YAWKEY CENTER

1 Yawkey Way South

A special bus trip will be offered, highlighting Revolutionary War sites on the property, including the Cat Island Fort, Revolution-era house sites, and a discussion of North Island and the Lafayette landing. These trips will be free but limited to 14 people each. Reservations are required. Two time slots are available: 10:00 -12:00 or 1:00 - 3:00.
